


INSTRUCTIONS 1. Cut out the four manger pieces (including baby Jesus) along black lines. 2. Assemble the manger by inserting the three tabs on the center piece into the three slots on each end piece. Fold the tabs flat and secure each with a piece of tape. 4. Place the baby Jesus in the manger with his head toward the taller "Head End." His "toes" should slide into the slit along the bottom of the manger to hold him gently in place. 5. Cut out the 24 present pieces. Mix them up and place them present-side-up in the manger. 6. Put your manger on display on the mantel. If you don't have a mantel, place it in a visible and important place at home. 7. Each day of December, pick a present from the manger. Look up and read the Bible verse together. 8. Follow the directions for the day, remembering that the good and loving things we do are done because God sent us the good and loving gift of Jesus! 9. On Christmas, return the manger to the mantel. Have a fun day celebrating Jesus' birthday.
