Isaiah 53:3**

- P** The apostle John said of Jesus, "He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him" (John 1:11). Jesus the Messiah was rejected and condemned. When he was betrayed and arrested, his disciples fled.

- P** We confess Jesus as Lord, yet we are not always faithful witnesses for him.

- C** **Jesus, our thoughts, words and actions do not always reflect our love for you. Forgive us and heal us.**

P He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces.

C **He was despised, and we esteemed him not.** (Isaiah 53:3)

P All who see me mock me; they make mouths at me; they wag their heads;

C **He trusts in the Lord ... let him rescue him, for he delights in him.** (Psalm 22:7-8)

P Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?"

C **They all said, "Let him be crucified!"**

P And he said, "Why, what evil has he done?"

C **But they shouted all the more, "Let him be crucified!"** (Matthew 27:22-23)

P Lord, do not let us fear rejection or persecution for the sake of your name.

C **Make us bold witnesses for you.**

A LITANY FOR THE SECOND WEEK OF LENT

**There was no deceit in his mouth.
Isaiah 53:9**

- P** Jesus was despised and rejected. He was falsely accused, yet he did not speak in his own defense or answer those who condemned him. He remained silent, like a lamb led to the slaughter, and took up his cross for our sake.

- P** We often speak out in loveless ways, out of anger and envy.
- C** **Lord, forgive our loveless thoughts and words. Give us speech that glorifies you.**

- P** He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth;
- C** **Like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth.** (Isaiah 53:7)
- P** Then Pilate said to him, "Do you not hear how many things they testify against you?"
- C** **But he gave him no answer, not even to a single charge, so that the governor was greatly amazed.** (Matthew 27:13-14)
- P** He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth.
- C** **When he was reviled, he did not revile in return;**
- P** When he suffered, he did not threaten,
- C** **But continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly.** (1 Peter 2:22-23)
- P** Lord, lead us to walk in love as you walked, so that our words and actions will be a blessing to others.
- C** **Fill us with words of comfort, hope and life to share with the world.**

But Christ, the heav'nly Lamb,

 A sacrifice of nobler name
 And richer blood than they.
