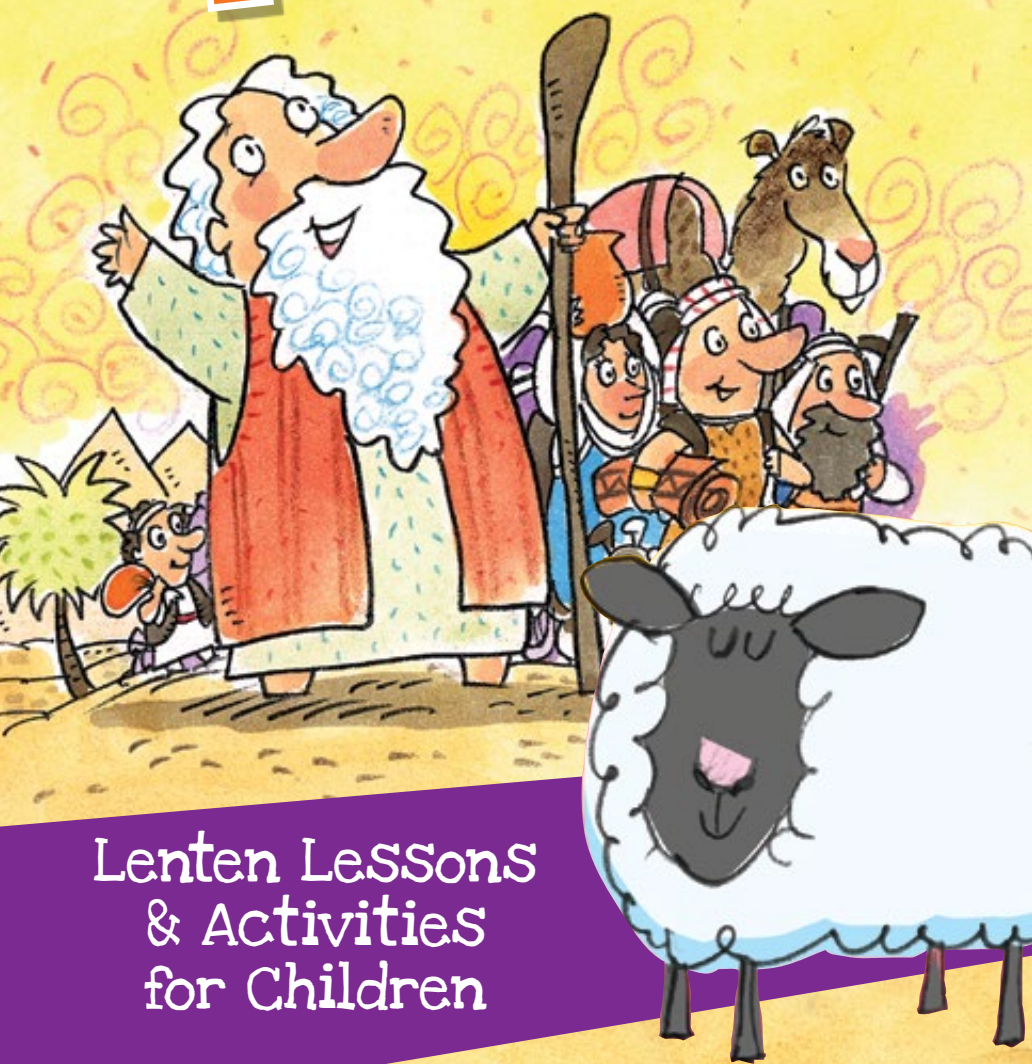

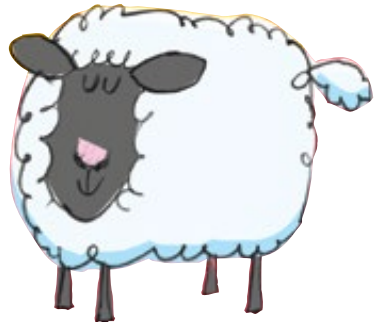

Passover Potluck!

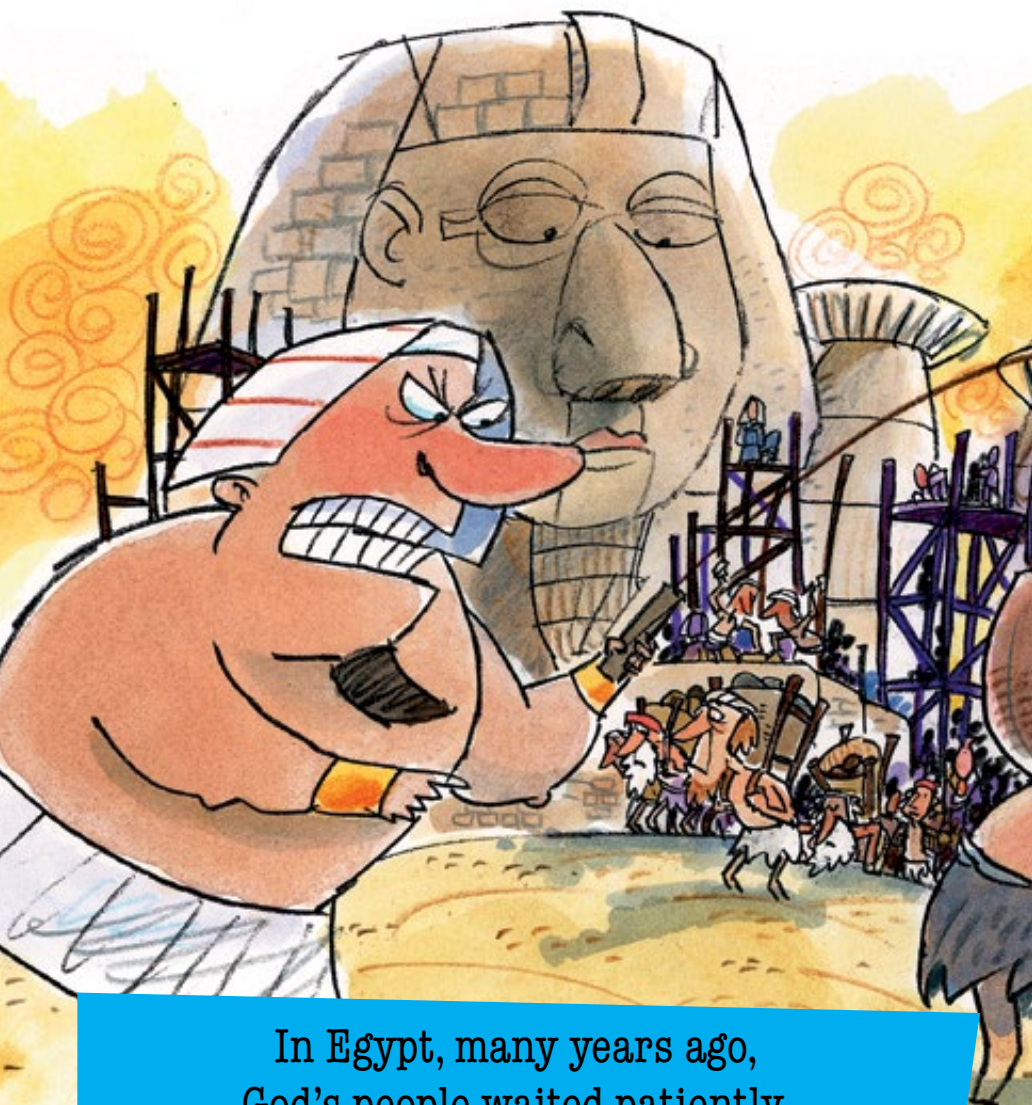
Hello, and welcome to the Passover Potluck. We've all been very busy with our Passover preparations! And we can't wait to show you what they have brought.

The First Passover

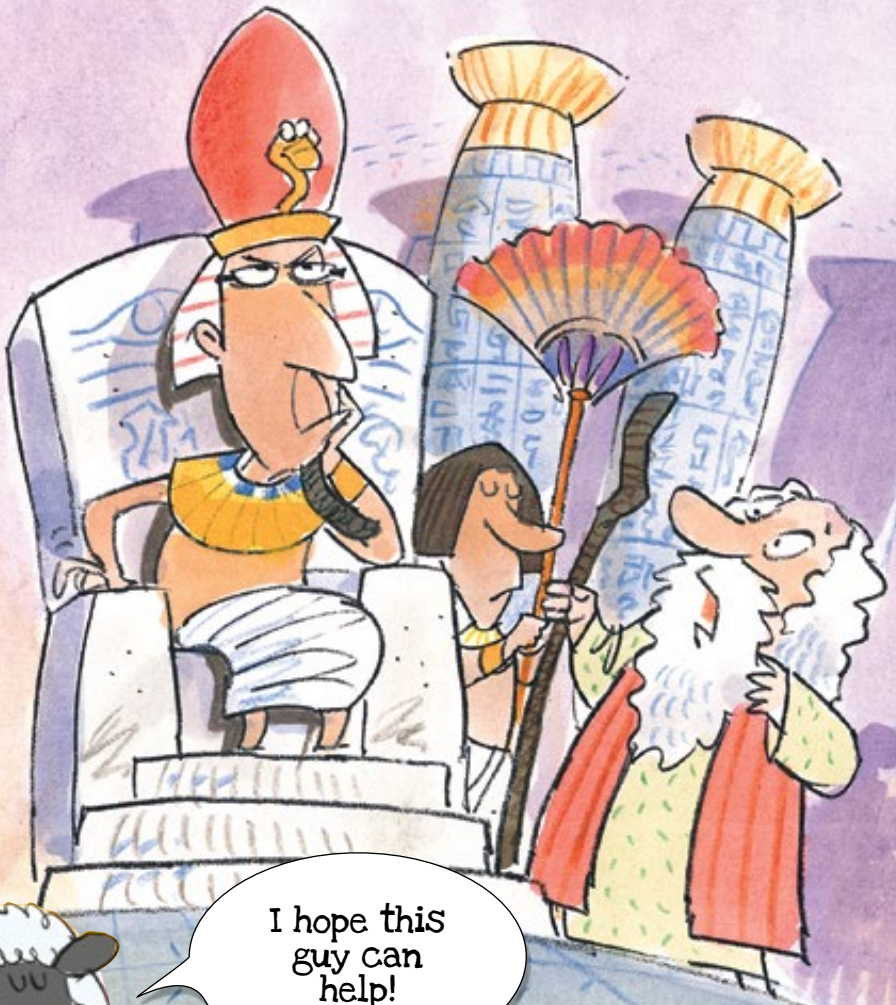


In Egypt, many years ago,

But left God's people all alone!




It passed

who believe!”

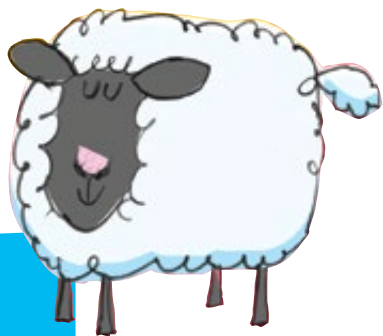


Thank you,
