A CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS SERVICE

Notes for Leaders

-Speaking Parts-

There are six sections with a total of 74 lines that can be assigned to three or more children, with one assigned as the "Foreman." If there is a large number of children available for speaking parts, different children can be assigned to each of the six sections. There are also 15 scripture readings (indicated by an R in the script), which can be read by one or more child(ren) or an adult. Longer readings can also be broken up to accommodate the number of parts needed. Characters can be dressed in biblical costumes with the addition of either orange vests and/or hardhats, or anything else that identifies them as construction workers. In addition, a scroll of some sort will be needed.

-Children's Songs-

Songs by children are indicated in the script and include "Angels We Have Heard on High," "Once in Royal David's City" and "Away in a Manger" (for youngest children). Additionally, children can be assigned verses for congregational hymns, if desired. All children with speaking and non-speaking parts should gather to sing in a designated area.

-Centerpiece Display-

A construction zone set-up including various work tools (shovels, rakes, etc.) and a heart-shaped sign reading "Work Zone" serves as a centerpiece display. Additional signs ("Stop" sign, "Baby on Board" sign, "Construction Entrance" sign, "Y Intersection" sign, "Slow" sign, "Merge" sign and "Paradise Next Exit" sign) should be added to the set when indicated in the script. Road sign images are included. The following are some ideas of how to make and display the road signs:

- Images can be enlarged and printed in color, then taped or glued to poster board (and cut to the size and shape of image) with thin dowel rods or paint sticks attached to back for stability.
- Images can be projected onto poster board and adjusted to desired size, then traced and colored.
- If screens are available, images of each sign can be displayed on the screen in addition to the physical sign, in order to increase visibility for those in attendance.
- Original signs can be drawn based on the images included.
- Road signs can be hung on a line or tacked to a backdrop placed on the set.
- Road signs can be mounted on free-standing bases by attaching a long, thick dowel rod to the base of the sign, then placing each sign in a bucket of sand or other material to keep it upright (or, a wooden base can be constructed).

-Nativity Tableau-

The script calls for costumed nativity characters including Mary, Joseph, angels, and shepherds. Instructions are included in the script as to when these characters should enter and exit. The nativity tableau is optional, but if using, a manger with a doll representing baby Jesus should be used. It can be set up on either side of the construction site centerpiece as space allows. An alternative to a live tableau would be to project images of Mary, Joseph, shepherds, angels and baby Jesus on a screen as indicated in the script.


A Meditation

P What have your Christmas preparations entailed this year? Probably a lot of work! There's shopping, cleaning, decorating, entertaining and lots of extra activities on our calendars. These preparations are all signs of the season. As exciting as they may be, frankly, Christmas preparations can be exhausting—so much so, that we may not have much energy left to do what God's Word tells us, "Prepare the way for the Lord!" The Advent season reminds us that we are to prepare for the coming of Jesus—to celebrate his birth and to look forward to the day he comes again to take us to be with him in heaven. But how do we really prepare for that? That sounds harder than trying to figure out what to buy for everyone on our Christmas lists! Don't worry. Jesus has already made all the necessary preparations for us. Today the children will show us how Jesus is preparing our hearts right now to receive him and honor him as our Savior and King. All we have to do is pay attention to the signs that he is truly Immanuel—"God-with-Us"—and respond to his presence, his love and his light in our lives. (inviting congregation to put hands on their hearts) Our hearts are God's work zone. Let's see how he leads us in his way.
