### First Sunday of Advent



Have you ever walked into a room and noticed that it smelled *clean*? Not just *looked* clean (sometimes when things are clean we just don't notice how they look)—but *smelled* clean?

Perhaps the first thing we notice as we look around the stable is not so much something we see as something we smell. Fresh straw does have a kind of clean smell. Somebody probably spread the straw around to help make the stable clean, maybe knowing a baby was about to be born there.

Cleaning often goes with preparing, getting ready like when company is coming. During these Advent weeks, we're supposed to be getting ready for Christ to come. Jesus came the first time to make us truly clean. Look around the stable. The straw says, "Get ready!"

Is there something you could do to help prepare for Christmas? Maybe a room (or a part of one) that you could clean?

Come into my heart this Advent season, and make it truly clean. Even so, help me prepare for your coming. Amen.

## First Monday of Advent

Look around the stable. Do you see the stones? Stones come in many sizes.

Big stones are used to build things—like walls to keep out what you don't want in, what might, in fact, be dangerous.

Little stones? Well, once a shepherd named David used a small stone in his sling to defeat an awful enemy.

And one day a huge stone would be rolled away from in front of Jesus' tomb to let us know that the worst enemy of all has been defeated, death.

Look around the stable. All of those stones say, "God will take care of you!"

Are there any stones (or things made of stone) where you live? How do you use them?
