INTRODUCTION	
We confess in the Apostles' Creed, "I believe in God, the Father	
Almighty, maker of heaven and earth." God created all things, and he	
reigns over the world in which we live. God also reigns through Christ	
Jesus over his Church, that is, over all who trust in Jesus for salvation.	
God's reign over all things, both earthly and spiritual, is sometimes de-	
scribed as his rule over two kingdoms. One of these realms is called the kingdom of God's right hand, or the kingdom of grace. The kingdom	
of grace is the Church, the Body of Christ. The other realm is called the	
kingdom of God's left hand, or the kingdom of power. The kingdom of	
power refers to God's rule over this earth through its governments and	
institutions. God is Lord and King over both kingdoms, but he rules	
over each in a different way.

THE KINGDOM OF GRACE	
The kingdom of God's right hand, also called the kingdom of grace,	
refers to Christ's rule over his Church. In this kingdom, Christ rules	
in grace and forgiveness according to the Gospel. In this kingdom, all	
who trust in Jesus receive forgiveness for their sins. We grow in faith	
as the Word of God is taught among us and as we receive the Lord's	
Supper. In the power of the Holy Spirit, we proclaim the Good News of salvation so others will hear and believe in Jesus as their Savior. Earthly	
kingdoms come to an end. "The LORD brings the counsel of nations to	
nothing" (Psalm 33:10), but of his Messiah, God says, "I will establish	
the throne of his kingdom forever" (2 Samuel 7:13).
